Okaloosa County to hold Town Halls for North Okaloosa Planning Study

Okaloosa County, Florida – Okaloosa County is moving forward with the next phase of a planning study to address the needs of the north end of the County as it continues its rapid growth. In addition to the public town hall meeting in 2023, two more town hall meetings have been scheduled in March 2024 as part of this process.
