The county has heard your requests! Starting this past Tuesday, April 21 the Hazardous Waste Dropoff is open Tuesday through Saturday from 7am-3pm in Fort Walton Beach. I tested it out on Tuesday morning. I was their first customer. I was greeted by Jim Reese, Recycling Coordinator and Jay Shartz, as I drove into the covered facility. The large warehouse is neat and clean and very organized. Within moments I was in and out and the customer behind me was unloaded. It is efficient and easy and encourages continued use.

The following items can be disposed of: Paint, Pesticides, Pool Chemical, Used Oil, Gas, Anti-freeze, Computers, Televisions, Fluorescent Lamps, Car Batteries, Re-chargeable Batteries, Cleaners, Solvents, Aerosol and more.
